# Working together

## After school care

Due to a recent change in circumstances, we are actively looking to start some after school wraparound care here at school. We are hopeful that this will be in place for the start of October to help support families where this is needed. Many thanks for your support in swiftly returning the recent letter where we asked you to express your interest. I will update you as soon as I can with a definite starting date and time.

## <u>Uniform</u>

The vast majority of our children have returned to school in full, appropriate uniform and look really smart. A polite reminder that trainers are not part of our uniform and should not be worn. Can I also please remind you that the black fleeces that were worn during winter last year will not be allowed in classrooms this year. They are to be worn as coats, not as a replacement for our purple school jumpers or cardigans.
