Year 2

We have had a very busy start to Year 2. We loved visiting White Lodge Farm and wrote brilliant recounts about our trip. In geography, we have explored London, and in science, we have learnt about different materials. In DT, we have thought about what makes a stable structure and have made our own structures based on landmarks.







Year 1

We have had a wonderful half term with the Year one children in Team seals and Team Starfish. We have loved our story about the Naughty Bus and are relieved to report the bus has been found after we put our WANTED posters up around school. We have explored our local area in Geography and materials and their properties in Science. We were inspired to create our own black and white art after exploring the work of artists Hans Hartung and Charles McGee. We have been working hard to write our numbers and letters with the correct formation. In the PSHE / wellbeing 'My happy mind' programme we have explored Team HAP and how we can help our brain by doing happy breathing.



Year 3

Year 3 have had a great start to the year. We started by making caves, cave people and making cave drawings to introduce our history topic Stone Age. We have read The First Drawings and Stone Age Boy which have helped us to write a non-chronological report on woolly mammoths and our very own Stone Age stories. In Science we have been learning about bones, muscles, tendons and nutrition. We also learned about endoskeletons and exoskeletons. In maths we have been learning how to add and subtract two 3 digit numbers using the column method.

We have ended the term with a D.T day making fruit kebabs and some delicious seasonal vegetable soup, although not everyone agreed.

Year S

Year 5 have enjoyed their studies this half-term, focusing on the ancient Maya civilisation - we have them to thank for chocolate!

Our WOW! Day included mask making, as the Maya were accomplished artists and used masks to represent some of the hundreds of gods they worshipped. They even had a god of chocolate! We studied their written language and used hieroglyphs to send each other messages. Following that, we had a maths lesson in Mayan! Yes, in Mayan. In art, we designed Mayan stelae and used them to print.

Science has been great with investigations identifying the properties of materials, separating different and similar materials, identifying soluble and insoluble materials! We've been very busy! Next half-term, we leave the Maya behind and our focus will be on a geography topic - biomes! We'll share with you what we learn!

Year 4

What a fantastic, activity-packed start to Year 4 we've had! We kicked off the term with an exciting WOW Day featuring fort building and hands-on mini archaeology, followed by high-energy dance workshops with Drew from York Dance Group and a gorgeous, sunny trip to Scarborough Castle to bring history to life. In the classroom, we've focused on Literacy by writing engaging diary entries for Willow the naughty school dog and crafting explanation texts detailing how our digestive system works, which linked directly to our Science experiments where we tested the effects of liquids on teeth and built a very gross, but informative, model of the digestive process using tights and plastic bags. Finally, in Maths, we've worked hard on column addition and subtraction and place value, while Art saw the children create wonderful pieces inspired by the unique style of Pablo Picasso.







Year 6

Year 6 have had an incredible half-term. In our Ancient Greek Topic: children took part in our very own 'Mini Ancient Greek Olympics'; explored and investigated a range of Greek artefacts; made our very own messy maps of Greece; and created beautiful Ancient Greek inspired masks.

We have truly loved our topic and our text- Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief - this half-term. We have learned all about the Greek Gods and have written amazing reports about them. In our History, we have enjoyed learning about the legendary empire of Alexander the Great, some of the amazing architecture of the 'Golden Age of Greece' and had great discussions around what we felt was the most important legacy of the Ancient Greeks - we could not decide between their influence on language or medicine.

Finally, we must mention our amazing workshop with the Royal Navy: ending with making and launching our very own flare!
